THIRD ANNUAL SELF-TRANSCENDENCE SWIM-RUN AT LAKE WELCH



From an inner point of view, the Self-Transcendence Swim-Run, held on Sunday, September 11, at Lake Welch Beach, Harriman State Park, could be seen as a sweet, transcendent victory for all who attended. There were over 40 athletes in attendance. The race was organized by the Sri Chinmoy Marathon Team, and open to runners and swimmers at every level of training. This race was unique because, inspired by Sri Chinmoy's philosophy of peace and self-transcendence, it was organized with the intention of bringing about camaraderie and personal best effort, rather than competition and winning over others. There were no monetary prizes or league qualifications to be gained, only the inner satisfaction of challenging oneself in new ways.

The many volunteers helping at numerous points along the course, cheering squads, well-staffed aid stations, and picnic lunch, all contributed to an ambiance of cheerful zeal, enthusiasm, and great fun, enabling the participants to dig deep and bring forward their own self-transcendence goal. Over 40 amateur athletes, among them local Naval Academy and West Point cadets, Master's athletes, as well as international athletes from Australia, Iceland, Siberia and New Zealand, all came together for a one-kilometer swim and ten-kilometer run in this beautifully lush and peaceful park in the lower Hudson Valley.

The winners of this year's race were Granantan Boyle for the men, (57:32) and Shobhavati Davies for the women, (1:09:18). In a close second for the women was Jessica McAnney, in a time of 1:09:54; this was her third second-place finish in the race's three year's history.
